The Department of Computer Science and Engineering (http://www.cse.msstate.edu) is seeking to fill one open position for a tenure-track faculty member at the Assistant/Associate Professor level. The primary areas of interest for this position is software engineering and computer security, however exceptional candidates in all areas will be considered.

Mississippi State University is a comprehensive land-grant institution with approximately 20,000 students and about 1,300 faculty members. The Department of Computer Science and Engineering has 16 tenure-track faculty positions and offers academic programs leading to the bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in computer science and bachelor's degrees in software engineering and computer engineering. Faculty members and graduate students work with a number of oncampus research centers. Research expenditures total about \$5.2 million dollars annually and the university as a whole is ranked 72nd among U.S. institutions in computer science expenditures.

Candidates for this position are expected to hold a PhD in computer science or closely related field (ABDs may be considered). Level of appointment is commensurate with qualifications and experience. The preferred candidate will have an established research record as demonstrated by significant publications beyond dissertation or research grants in relevant areas. Experience in teaching university courses in computer science is also preferred.

A letter of application, curriculum vita, teaching and research statements, and names and contact information of at least three references must also be submitted. Review of applications will begin as early as November 2015 and will continue until the position is filled.
